A member of this team, along with additional press room volunteers, will be staffing all press room operations throughout race weekend (see Working Press Room and Race Day Press Tent below).

Credential Levels

There are three levels of media access:

- **Photographer (video and still)**
- **Photo Moto (shooting from a motorcycle)**
- **Media (all other)**

The Media Credential will be a credential tag worn on a lanyard; the Photographer credential will be a high-visibility yellow vest; and the Photo Moto credential will be a specifically numbered, high-visibility yellow vest.

Media Credentials can be picked up from the Working Press Room (Logan Hotel) or Race Day Press Tent (Benjamin Franklin Parkway) according to press room hours (see below).

Yellow Photo Vests can be picked up on Sunday morning only at Race Day Press Tent (see Photography and Priority Vests below).

Credentialed TV crews will be able to show their station identification for access.

Road Access with Credential

A credential **DOES NOT** guarantee complete access to the race course, as some areas are restricted to only those with an assigned photo vest.

A prime area at the start/finish line will be designated for those with assigned photo vests. You will be required to wear and show your credential or vest to receive access to these areas as well as to the winner press conferences (one for the women's race, one for the men's race).

Limits apply to the number of photographer vests issued and the number of photographers able to travel on the photo motos.

In all cases, race media operations personnel have final discretion as to where credentialed media can be positioned at any point during the race.

Photography and Priority Vests

Yellow photo vests are limited to approximately 20 credentialed photographers.

Of those, a limited number (6) will have access to photo motos. These will be designated by an assigned number on their yellow photo vest. (Note: Most photo vests will have numbers; only certain designated numbers will have access to the photo moto.)

Yellow vests must be picked up on Sunday, Aug. 30 at the Race Day Press Tent (see below). (Note: If credentialed photographers need to coordinate an earlier pick-up, please contact a member of the Media Team.)

A form of identification, such as a valid driver's license, will be exchanged for a vest upon pick-up. The ID will be returned upon receipt of the vest back at the Race Day Press Tent by 5:30 p.m. on Sunday, Aug. 30. **No exceptions will be made, so please come prepared.**

Organizers reserve the right to determine priority access to the road at start and finish line for photographers.

Only credentialed broadcast/photo media will have access to certain restricted media zones on or near the race course on race day.

Any photographer that fails to follow instructions and safety measures will be subject to losing race credentials and be removed from the event.

Moto Pit: Press Cars and Photo Moto

Press Cars: Credentialed photographers & journalists will have access to press cars (3) from the Moto Pit near the start/finish line in order to move to other positions on the course.

- The press cars travel in the caravan and can make a stop in Manayunk and Lemon Hill.
- There is no guarantee on timing for return trips/rides from Manayunk and/or Lemon Hill to the Benjamin Franklin Parkway in time for race finishes.
- There will be NO pick-ups on the (2) small laps to finish the race.

While in a press car, all body parts must stay inside the vehicle. If press personnel permit riders to hold onto vehicles, they shall be removed from the caravan and suspended for a duration of which is commensurate with the incident.

Photographing and filming from a moving press vehicle (car/van) is prohibited. It is forbidden to interview riders as they race.

Photo Moto: Credentialed photographers designated for Photo Moto will have access to (1) Moto. Rides will be coordinated at the Moto Pit near the start/finish line.

- Motos will be assigned as noted (see Photography & Priority Vests above).
- Organizers reserve the right to determine the priority Moto access, which is limited. Not all requests can be fulfilled.
- Motos will be driven by qualified drivers provided by the race organizers.
- All photographers on Photo Motos are required to sign a waiver before getting on a Moto.
- All photographers on a Moto are required to wear a helmet – either their own or one provided by the organizers. Two (2) three-quarter helmets with windshield will be provided; one is size Medium, the other Large.

IMPORTANT NOTES: SAFETY FIRST

Please adhere to all instructions given by race officials, marshals, and law enforcement. Their objective is to ensure the races and the route are secure and safe for everyone.

In all cases, please do not hinder the riders in any way. Stay back, well off the field of play, so that the cyclists have room to make their moves unimpeded, and **never touch the riders**.

Media Team members are available throughout race weekend to answer any questions, coordinate interviews, and assist you as you report on the event.

ABOUT THE CLASSIC

The Philadelphia Cycling Classic presented by AmeriGas® unfolds across a dynamic 14.4-mile circuit that highlights the city's most iconic landmarks while delivering a technically demanding test for the world's top professional cyclists.

The race begins and finishes on the Benjamin Franklin Parkway, the grand, Parisian-inspired boulevard stretching from Logan Circle to the Philadelphia Museum of Art. From there, riders head west along the Schuylkill River, navigating the sweeping curves of Kelly Drive and passing through Fairmount Park, the nation's largest urban park system.

The course then moves into the historic neighborhood of Manayunk, where cyclists race down Main Street Manayunk before turning onto the race's defining feature: the Manayunk Wall. Climbing Levering Street and Lyceum Avenue at grades reaching 17%, this ascent is widely regarded as one of the most challenging urban climbs in American cycling, often shaping the outcome of the race.

After cresting the Wall, riders pass briefly through Roxborough before descending back toward the river. The peloton then tackles Lemon Hill in Fairmount Park, a short but punchy climb positioned across from the iconic Boathouse Row. From there, competitors return to the Parkway to complete the loop and begin the next lap.

The Women's Race is approximately 62 miles (100km), which includes four laps of the 14.4-mile course and then two laps of a smaller circuit within the course of 3.3 miles from the Parkway to Lemon Hill. The Men's Race will take on the same course for approximately 120 miles (200km), and they will complete eight laps of the 14.4-mile course and then two laps of the smaller circuit.

The Philadelphia Cycling Classic presented by AmeriGas® is sanctioned by the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) and USA Cycling. The Women's and Men's races have a equal prize lists of \$75,000.

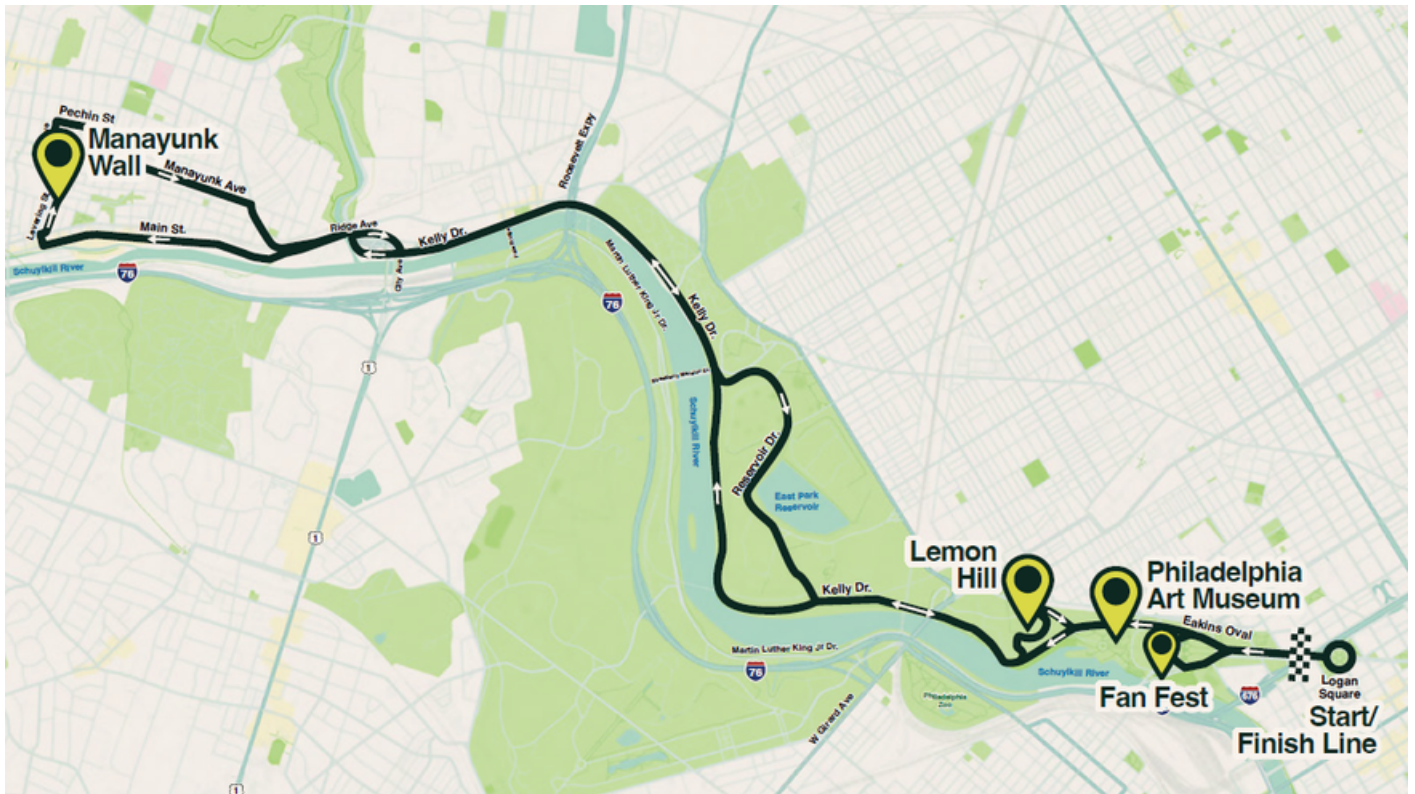

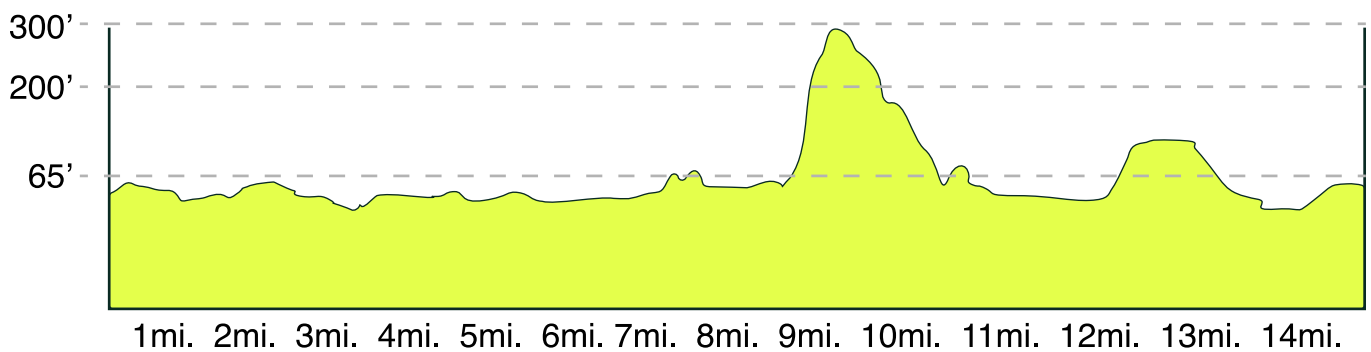

2026 WOMEN'S RACE PREVIEW

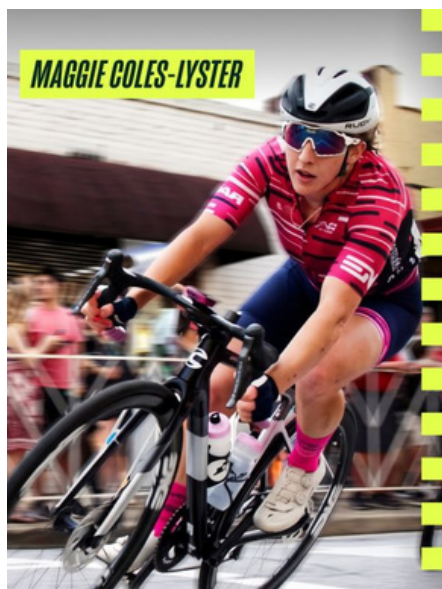
Insights from John Eustice

Olympic champions, Pan American Games champions, National champions and top racers from across the globe will grace the start line of the Women's Philadelphia Cycling Classic this Aug. 30.

Headlining the stellar field is America's **Kristen Faulkner of the EF Education** – Oatly team, whose double Olympic Gold medal performance at the Paris Games made her the first American woman, and third in history, to have won two Golds in two different disciplines in the same Games. A clearly powerful racer with a turn of speed, the Harvard-educated Faulkner will be guided in the race by team captain **Alexis Magner**, with 19-year-old Belgian sprinter **Arke De Buysser** waiting in the wings should Faulkner fail to crack open the field before the finish.



Italy's boisterous **Chiara Consonni**, 2024 Olympic champion on the track in the Madison race, is a racer who seems to be tailor made for Philadelphia. Looking to add to the long history of Italian wins at the event, Consonni, of the Canyon/SRAM team, is wickedly fast and powerful to boot. In addition to her Olympic achievements, the Bergamasca boasts five World and five European track championships plus wins in hard northern European road races. She will make the entire field nervous, especially as she will be backed by one of the strongest teams in all of women's cycling.



The race has always smiled on sprinters and track-trained **Maggie Coles-Lyster** of the Human Powered Health team, a very fast two-time Canadian National Road champion, will be the leader of that team. Her international squad of Italian, Spanish, Austrian and Dutch members is expert and up to the task.

The enigmatic presence of XDS China brings great interest to the event. The Chinese women have just begun racing outside of their home country, generally staying in Asia with strong performances in Vietnam and Uzbekistan. Philadelphia will be their first foray into the West. **Hao Zang**, the Asian Continental Road Champion, and 2024 Chinese National Road Champion, winner of three good international races, will be one to watch.

Italy's Vini Fantini brings their "Diamond," 22-year-old **Gaia Segato**, National Time Trial Champion and consistent performer in stage races, to the event with Spain's Marina Garau, a U-23 European track champion, as a second option in their quest for victory.

Fans should absolutely follow the performance of Cuba's **Marlies Mejias** of the Virginia's Blue Ridge TWENTY28 team. Considered as perhaps Cuba's greatest-ever racer, Mejias's endless list of Pan American and Caribbean championships, on both the road and track, date to 2010 and continue to this day. Strong, very fast and incredibly experienced, the Cuban champion will be guided by heralded Mexican teammate **Sofia Arreola** and backed by some of the finest developing young riders the USA has to offer.

Other riders to watch include **Lauren Stephens**, the 2023 Pan Am Games Road Champion, 2024 Pan Am Championships Road winner and prolific race winner. An early advocate of gravel racing as shown by her two wins at the Unbound Gravel, her Ageis x Land of Enchantment team has a strong and proven leader to work for.

Also keep an eye on the Lambertville, NJ team of Fearless Femmes p/b The Beasley Firm. Their star sprinter, **Skylar Schneider**, just retired from the grind of Europe's World Tour, has a fresh perspective on the sport and will be deadly should a large group come to the finish together.

Lastly, Philadelphia-local **Kim Stoveld**, late to the sport, but powerful due to her years as a competitive swimmer, who has shown that she can win, could very well have her word to say in such a long, and hard event. The home crowds will certainly be pushing her on.



2026 MEN'S RACE PREVIEW

Insights from John Eustice

Captain America is coming to Philadelphia. Backed by two of the strongest racers in the world and flanked by three superb fast-men, **Quinn Simmons**, the three-time United States National Professional Road Champion and the racer voted as “Best Teammate” of the past two Tours de France for his powerful and unselfish devotion to team objectives, has the chance, finally, to race for his own glory.

It should be noted that despite his massive efforts to protect and further the successful Green Jersey quest of team leader **Mads Pedersen**, Simmons, resplendent in the Stars and Stripes jersey denoting the national champion, still finished as the 6th Young Rider and 18th overall at the 2026 Tour, proof of his massive strength. With his long, flowing red hair and handlebar moustache, the American, who is enormously popular with the French for his attacking style and brash, open personality, will have a great chance to prove that he is indeed a tactically astute racer, one able to put together all of the needed pieces to win for himself. Philadelphia will be a big test for Simmons, a determinant moment for the future direction of his career.



Ottawa's **Derek Gee** will be co-leader with Simmons for Lidl-Trek, the Canadian certainly considered as one of the strongest men in the world. He was fifth at the Giro d'Italia this year followed by a last-minute callup and subsequent tremendous team effort at the Tour de France, fourth at the Giro in 2025, and ninth in the Tour de France in 2023, all which add up to the performances of an amazingly strong and consistent racer. What's more, the 6'2", 158-pounder is not only able to climb the Alps and Dolomites with the best, but he's wicked fast as his double Pan American Track Championship Golds and 11 National Track titles prove.

The third power man on the Lidl-Trek squad is Londoner **Tao Geoghegan Hart**, winner of the Giro d'Italia in 2020, but who, since those glory days, has suffered through the effects of illness and a bad crash at the 2023 Giro. He remains strong and extremely experienced and will be a key factor in orchestrating the team assault on the roads of Philadelphia.

Should the race come down to a sprint, Lidl-Trek has the answers. 24-year-old **Tim Torn Teutenberg**, from a dynastic cycling family (his aunt, Ina Yoko Teutenberg, won Philadelphia in 2005, 2008, 2009 and 2010), is a world champion track racer, winner of the U-23 Paris-Roubaix and Holland's Olympia Tour, and a major sprinting threat. Veteran Belgian **Otto Vergaerde**, a professional lead-out man, will guide the fast boys.

Team JAYCO AlUla is led by **Anders Foldanger**, an all-around racer from the tough climate of northern Denmark. The 25-year-old is fast, as shown by his field sprint win at the Brabantse Pijl in Belgium this year, and strong with excellent performances at the Baby Giro and Tour de l'Avenir as an amateur in 2023. Team Captain, **Luka Mezgec**, at 38 years of age, a man who carved the path for the Slovenian champions who followed such as Primož Roglič and Tadej Pogačar, will provide expert race guidance for the young Dane.

EF Education-EasyPost's sprinter **Luke Lamperti** must be considered a favorite for the win. The 23-year-old Californian, considered the youngest-ever winner of the National Elite Criterium Championship at 18 (although Philadelphia's Steve Scurren, winner of that title in 1985 at the tender age of 16, and on restricted junior gears no less, might take issue with the idea) had a breakthrough Spring campaign with a prestigious stage win at Paris-Nice. His season has been somewhat quiet since then but is currently in Belgium preparing for the biggest race he's ever done on home soil.

Tour de France standout **Sean Quinn**, so powerful in forging the wins and Polka Dot Jersey triumph of team leader Richard Carapaz, and who was once only :28 out of the Yellow Jersey, is more than a climber. He is quick and wins sprints from small groups. The two team leaders are backed by a group of excellent young riders, including **Colby Simmons**, brother of Quinn Simmons.

NSN Cycling Team brings a set of strong, fast sprinters led by Boulder, Colorado's **Riley Sheehan**, currently enjoying an excellent season with three international victories in his pocket. Sheehan, who astonishingly won the Paris-Tours classic as his first-ever pro race, is blessed with deep strength in addition to a turn of speed, as his performances in stage races such as Volta Valenciana, the Lidl Deutschland Tour, Arctic Race of Norway, and his crushing dominance of the Joe Martin stage race in 2023, certainly demonstrate.

The team has another sprint option in Israeli **Oded Kogut**, a pure sprinter who on his day is the equal of the fastest men in the world. The team will be captained by lead-out pro **Tom Van Asbroeck**, a Belgian who was once top 10 at Paris-Roubaix.

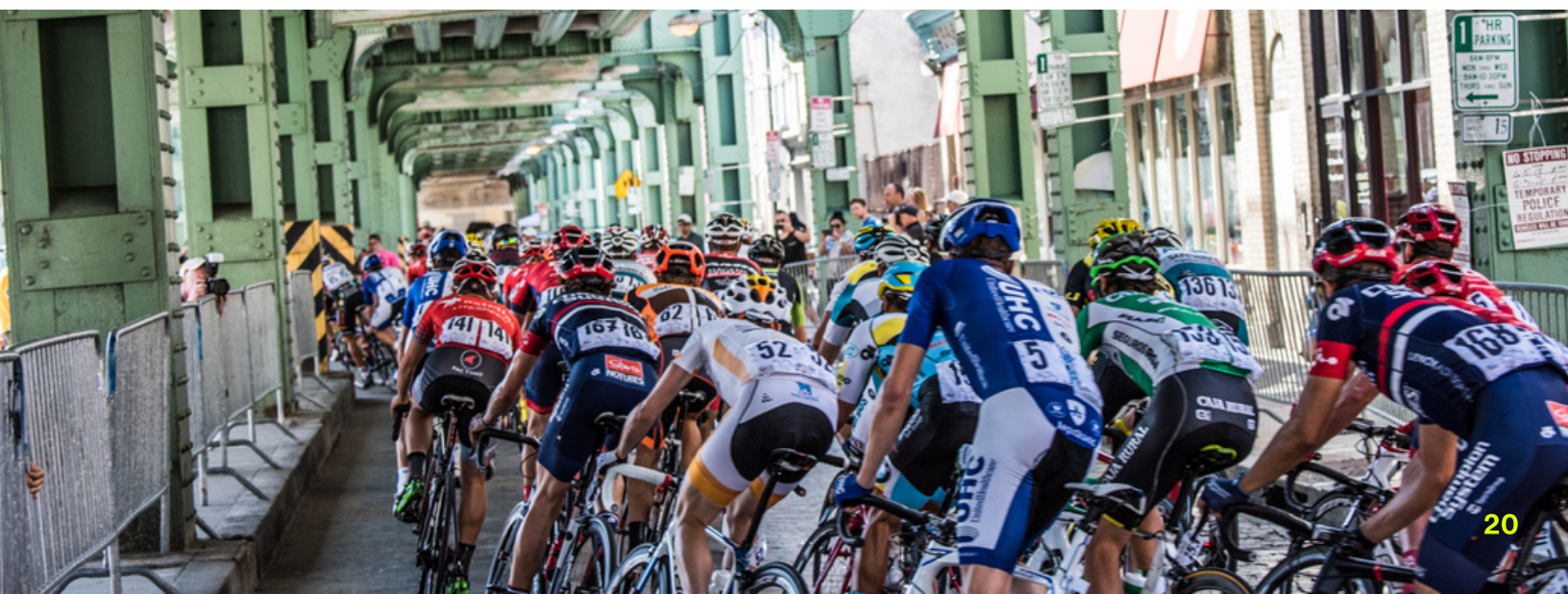

Lotto-Intermarchè has the second-tallest rider in the race in 6'6" **Jonas Rutsch**. The German was sixth at Paris-Roubaix in 2025 and brings a wealth of experience to the team who are bringing their future stars to the race. **Simone Gualdi**, 23, is in his first year of pro racing after an excellent U-23 career and an Italian Junior National Road Championship, and Norway's **Felix Ørn-Kristoff**, 20, two-time European Junior Road Champion, are coming to make names for themselves.

Hoping to join fellow Roman Paolo Cimini (1990) as a winner in Philadelphia is **Martin Marcellusi** of the Bardiani-CSF 7Saber team. Known as a breakaway artist who launches long in prestigious races – he was superb in Milano-Sanremo and the final stage to Rome at the Giro d'Italia this year – Marcellusi is also a very fast sprinter. Beware of him at the finish if he's anywhere near the front.

The Cinderella story of **Ben Oliver** is a wonder. The New Zealander spent most of his career working odd jobs to support his racing, once as a beekeeper, before washing up on American shores last year. His dominant performances on the domestic circuit caught the eye of George Hincapie, who took a risk and brought him into his Modern Adventure Pro Cycling team. Talk about a lucky gamble. Oliver, in his first-ever foray into European racing, at the ripe old age of 30, won the Tour de Wallonie overall, the points and two stages giving Modern Adventure their first European victories. He was third in a field sprint in Vuelta a Andalucia Ruta Ciclista Dei Sol against some of the top in the world, making the Kiwi a major threat for Philadelphia.

We will be able to judge the level of our domestic racing class through the performances of the remaining, US-registered teams, many of them developmental. Do keep an eye on 19-year-old **Kai Lokey** in his first year of road racing. He was a fine 17th in the US Professional Road Championships, a most promising result for a new racer.
